 - i. Finance Summary & Current Cash Flow through 12/31/2022
 - 1. Lease Aid was submitted in December and approved last week
 - 2. John Klockeman asks for clarification on deferred maintenance expenses regarding Paladin and the building company, giving an example of the rooftop air unit that needs to be replaced. Eric explained that these types of expenses are the direct responsibility of the school.
 - 3. As a follow up, John asks if there is a board approval process for major improvements like the one previously described. Frank suggests that any expense beyond, as an example, \$10,000, requires approval by the board. This will be further discussed at the February board meeting.

 - i. December 13th, 2022 the MN Supreme Court agreed to hear the Appeal of the Plaintiffs (Petitioners) in the Cruz-Guzman case. The Supreme Court also agreed that the ACLU and ACLU of Minnesota, as well as the group of law professors, may submit amici curiae in support of the petitioners. The Petitioners now have 30 days to submit their brief to

- the Court. At some point after the various parties in the case submit their response to the Petitioner's brief, the Supreme Court will have a live hearing before the court.

 - a. NWEA MAP Winter Assessment Update
 - i. 113 students completed the Math progress check last week
 - ii. Reading progress checks and Make up opportunities next week.
 - b. Block 3 Analysis
 - i. Block 3 Credit Analysis (22-23)
 - ii. Our opportunity gaps have decreased block 1 through block 3. A gap based on ethnicity is now the largest gap at 6%, with Black / African American students earning slightly fewer credits compared to their white and latinx peers.
 - iii. Students qualifying for Free/Reduced lunch earned 2% more credits proportionally than their peers who qualify for paid lunch. This is the first time in years that this has been the case.
 - c. 2022-23 School Year Attendance Data Jan 13, 2023
 - i. 2022-23 School Year Attendance Data Jan 13, 2023
 - ii. Our enrollment number has jumped dramatically this year, with 29 more students enrolled than last year at this time. Additionally, our average attendance rate this year has similarly jumped by 7% compared to last year and the highest we have on record.

- iii. We have often observed that inconsistent attendance is one of the greatest barriers to our students' success, so this data shows the opportunity that lies before us. Never before have our students been so present, so engaged, and so productive. Our student credit attainment is also the highest it's been.
- iv. Huge shout out to our teachers, SSCs, and our Engagement Coordinator for their combined efforts to keep our students engaged in school!
