 - i. Much like in block 1, there were virtually NO credit attainment disparities between any population groups. The largest opportunity gap was a mere 4% by gender. Again, there were NO gaps between students based on economic status.
 - ii. 167 credits and 65 court of honor members is a huge achievement, up slightly from 162 credits and 56 CoH members in block 1 of this year, and significantly increased from what we saw in block 2 of last year. Sarah added that our increase to attendance is remarkable at 83% attendance, we've gone up 11% in one year.
